The City of Beaverton is seeking sealed proposals from qualified consultants to provide design and engineering services for the renovation of the Library Fountain, located at Beaverton City Park, northwest corner of SW 5th St and SW Hall Blvd. Included elements of this project are relocation of the underground vault that contains the mechanical equipment for the fountain, upgrading of mechanical equipment & piping, and replacement & resizing of the fountain splash pad. Consultants are invited to submit a proposal outlining their experience and qualifications in performing work directly related to the services required.

Sealed proposals will be received until 2:00 pm on December 6, 2016 at the Finance Utility Billing Counter on the fourth floor of the Beaverton Building, City Hall at 12725 SW Millikan Way., Beaverton, Oregon 97005, Attention: Terry L. Muralt, CPPB, Purchasing Agent. There will be no formal opening. Facsimile proposals will not be accepted. Proposals will not be accepted after the stated opening date and time. Late proposals will be returned to the vendor unopened.

There will be no pre-proposal conference held in connection with this procurement.

Proposers are required to certify non-discrimination in employment practices in accordance with ORS 279A.110(4), and identify resident status as defined in ORS 279A.120(1). Pre-qualification of proposer is not required. All proposers are required to comply with the provisions of Oregon Revised Statutes and Beaverton's Contract Review Board Policy.

The City of Beaverton reserves the right (1) to reject any or all proposal not in compliance with public bidding procedures, 2) to postpone award of the contract for a period not to exceed ninety (90) days from date of proposal opening, (3) to waive informalities in the proposals, and (4) to select the proposal which appears to be in the best interest of the City.
