# THE COMMUNITY

Beaverton is located seven miles west of Portland and has a population of approximately 94,215. - Host weekly storytimes and programs for children, tweens and teens that engage participants and foster a love for reading and libraries

- Provide an excellent understanding of early literacy and its importance to the individual, the community, and the vital role the library plays in developing early literacy in youth and wants share that with our local community

The ideal candidate will be technologically savvy, including having experience with resources, and knowledge of social media trends and their use in a library environment.









This position will primarily focus on programing and assisting patrons with reference and reader's advisory questions. This position includes evening and weekend work hours.
