THE POSITION

The Senior Accountant will serve on a professional management team responsible for a variety of high level accounting and program tasks. Principal assignments will include assisting with an upgrade of utility billing software, assist with management of enterprise fund accounting, management of passport and business license services, federal grant reporting and assisting with the preparation of the comprehensive annual financial report.



THE IDEAL CANDIDATE

Minimum Qualifications

- Bachelor's degree in accounting, finance, business administration, or related field
- Five years of experience in accounting, including two years in a municipal setting with one year experience in a supervisory or lead role
- Other combinations of education and experience which provides the applicant with the knowledge, skills and abilities required to perform the job may be considered when combined with a CPA license
- Ability to pass reference and background check

Preferred Qualifications

- A strong background in the preparation of annual, comprehensive financial statements
- Certified public accountant (CPA) license

RESPONSIBILITIES

Essential functions of the job include:

- Develop, review, approve and implement section work plans, services, policies, procedures and reports; evaluate performance and program effectiveness and take action for improvement as necessary
- Supervise staff to ensure city goals and objectives are met
- Monitor the city's financial activities including review and preparation of monthly journal entries; reconcile ledgers, subsidiary ledgers, grants and intergovernmental agreements
- Participate in the preparation of annual reports; respond to auditors' requests
- Participate in updating financial plans including bond issues and bond refunding
- Assist in the preparation of the city's annual and supplemental budgets in accordance with state and local budget laws and regulations
- Provide direction and set standards for excellence in internal and external customer service
- Serves as internal auditor, reviewing databases and accounting records for anomalies, discrepancies, and variances, making recommendations for correction and process improvement
- Support and respect diversity in the workplace
