THE POSITION

The Water System Specialist will perform duties in accordance with the Oregon Health Authority to maintain water quality and ensure the integrity of the city's water distribution system. The successful candidate will provide efficient and cost effective installation, maintenance, and repair to city water distribution systems.

THE IDEAL CANDIDATE

The ideal candidate will be a collaborative, hard-working, team-oriented, person who likes to work in a fast-paced environment.

Minimum Qualifications

- High school diploma or GED
- Four years experience in water distribution systems, including responsibilities for operating telemetry equipment
- One year experience operating heavy equipment used in the field
- Two and a half years experience in a lead role in a water distribution system
- Other combinations of education and experience which provides the applicant with the knowledge, skills and abilities required to perform the job may be considered
- CDL A with air brake and tank endorsement
- Oregon Health Division Water Distribution Operator Water Certificate I
- Flagger training required within three months of employment
- CPR and First Aid certification required within six months of employment
- Ability to pass drug screen, physical exam, background and reference check

Preferred Qualifications

- Oregon Health Division Backflow Certificate
- Oregon Health Division Water Treatment Level I or higher
- Oregon Health Division Water Distribution Operator Water Certificate II or higher
- Experience using Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA)

RESPONSIBILITIES

The Water Systems Specialist can expect to be:

- Collecting, entering and analyzing infrastructure data using asset management software.
- Operating equipment including vactor, loader, backhoe, ten/five -yard dump truck, street cutting saw, jack hammer, trenching machine and other equipment as assigned.
- Monitoring and responding to SCADA information as required to keep system operating to provide safe, uninterrupted service.
- Inspecting installations and communicate effectively with the city engineering, planning and project lead.



RESPONSIBILITIES

- Overseeing and/or set up traffic control for worksites, including performing flagging functions.
- Performing operation and repair maintenance on a variety of water distribution devices and lines.
- Removing, repairing and replacing meters, hydrants, valves and other devices.
- Completing paperwork including tracking and documenting materials usage.
- Carrying pager as part of staff rotation.
- Assisting in notifying citizens of scheduled projects.
- Responding to emergency situations as needed
- Supporting and respecting diversity in the workplace.
- Performing other duties as assigned.



COMPENSATION

Salary Range: \$21.56-\$28.88 per hour

Starting salary will be determined depending on relevant work experience. The city pays the full retirement contribution to PERS; provides employees with an opportunity to participate in a deferred compensation retirement plan; tuition reimbursement program available; public service loan forgiveness program; and offers excellent health, dental, vision and life insurance coverage.
