CITY OF BEAVERTON REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL BROWNFIELDS ASSESSMENT PUBLIC OUTREACH, ENVIRONMENTAL SITE CHARACTERIZATION, AND CLEANUP PLANNING Solicitation #2864-14B

The City of Beaverton is seeking sealed proposals from qualified contractors to provide professional environmental services to manage an Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) funded brownfields assessment project which includes planning and reporting, coordinating public involvement, overseeing and administering brownfield site inventory and characterization, conducting Phase I and Phase II Environmental Assessments, and advising on cleanup planning. Contractors are invited to submit a proposal outlining their experience and qualifications in performing work directly related to the services required.

Sealed proposals will be received until 2:00 pm on Monday, February 3, 2014, at the Finance Utility Billing Counter on the second floor at 4755 SW Griffith Dr., Beaverton, Oregon 97005, Attention: Terry L. Muralt, CPPB, Purchasing Agent. There will be no formal opening. Facsimile proposals will not be accepted. Proposals will not be accepted after the stated closing date and time. Late proposals will be returned to the applicant unopened.

Proposers are required to certify non-discrimination in employment practices in accordance with ORS 279A.110(4), and identify resident status as defined in ORS 279A.120(1). Pre-qualification of proposer is not required. All proposers are required to comply with the provisions of Oregon Revised Statutes and Beaverton's Contract Review Board Policy.

The City of Beaverton reserves the right (1) to reject any or all proposals not in compliance with public bidding procedures, 2) to postpone award of the contract for a period not to exceed ninety (90) days from date of proposal opening, (3) to waive informalities in the proposals, and (4) to select the proposal which appears to be in the best interest of the City.
