CITY OF BEAVERTON REQUEST FOR QUALIFICATIONS ENGINEERING AND OTHER RELATED PROFESSIONAL SERVICES Solicitation 2991-15B

The City of Beaverton seeks proposals from qualified firms or individuals to provide engineering and other professional services related to one or more of the following categories: (A) transportation services (transportation improvements, traffic engineering), (B) environmental services (environmental site assessments and investigations and/or natural resource assessments), (C) geotechnical services, (D) utility infrastructure improvements (water and waterworks improvements, storm water and wastewater improvements), (E) contract technical support services (survey services, private utility locating services, utility potholing services, construction management and/or inspection services), (F) real property, right-of-way and easement acquisition, negotiation, and relocation services and/or (G) real property, right-of-way and easement appraisal services managed by the City of Beaverton Engineering and Technical Services departments.

Sealed proposals will be received until 2:00 pm on June 18, 2015, at The Beaverton Building, Finance Utility Billing Counter on the fourth floor at 12725 SW Millikan Way, Beaverton, Oregon 97005, Attention: Terry L. Muralt, CPPB, Purchasing Agent. There will be no formal opening. Facsimile proposals will not be accepted. Proposals will not be accepted after the stated opening date and time. Late proposals will be returned to the vendor unopened.

A **voluntary informational pre-proposal meeting** will be held at 9:30 AM on June 4, 2015, at The Beaverton Building, City Hall, in the Council Chambers at address listed above. Attendance is not mandatory for the proposal to be deemed responsive.

Proposers are required to certify non-discrimination in employment practices, and identify resident status as defined in ORS 279A.120(1). Pre-qualification of proposers is not required. All proposers are required to comply with the provisions of Oregon Revised Statutes and Beaverton's Purchasing Code.

The City of Beaverton reserves the right (1) to reject any or all proposal not in compliance with public bidding procedures, 2) to postpone award of the contract for a period not to exceed sixty (60) days from date of proposal opening, (3) to waive informalities in the proposals, and (4) to select the proposal which appears to be in the best interest of the City.
