THE IDEAL CANDIDATE


The ideal candidate will be a collaborative, hard-working, team-oriented, person who likes to work in a fast-paced environment.

Minimum Qualifications

- High school diploma or GED
- Three years experience in water distribution systems operations and maintenance
- Commercial Driver's License-B with air brake endorsement and the ability to meet the city's driving standards
- Tanker endorsement required by end of probation (six months)
- CPR and First Aid certification within six months
- Traffic Flagger training required within three months of employment
- Oregon Health Division Water Distribution Operator Certificate I required within one year
- Oregon Health Division Water Distribution Operator in Training Certificate required at first opportunity after date of hire
- Ability to pass drug screen, physical exam, background and reference check

Preferred Qualifications

- Oregon Health Authority Backflow Certificate
- Commercial Driver's License- A with tank endorsement



RESPONSIBILITIES

The Water Distribution Technician can expect to:


- Maintain, repair, disinfect and replace main and service distribution lines.
- Perform system flushing, exercise valves, and maintain/repair or replace hydrants.
- Take special water samples and deliver to the lab.
- Maintain records and maps as required by state and federal regulations.
- Operate heavy equipment.
- Replace meters, meter boxes, verify pressure, develop and initiate leak detection strategies, operate correlation equipment.
- Set up safe work zones including traffic controls, shoring and confined space entry.
- Have the ability to perform critical infrastructure assessment and document using asset management system for future system master planning.
- Repair concrete curbs, sidewalks, driveways and landscapes after utility repairs.
- Provide excellence in internal and external customer service.
- Support and respect diversity in the workplace.
- Perform other duties as assigned.

Qualifying veterans and disabled veterans may obtain preference by submitting as verification of eligibility a copy of the Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty (DD Form 214 or 215) or a letter from the US Department of Veterans Affairs indicating receipt of a non-service connected pension. Disabled veterans must also submit a copy of their veteran's disability preference letter from the Department of Veterans Affairs, unless the information is included in the DD Form 214 or 215. Veterans' preference documentation must be submitted with your application.

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
